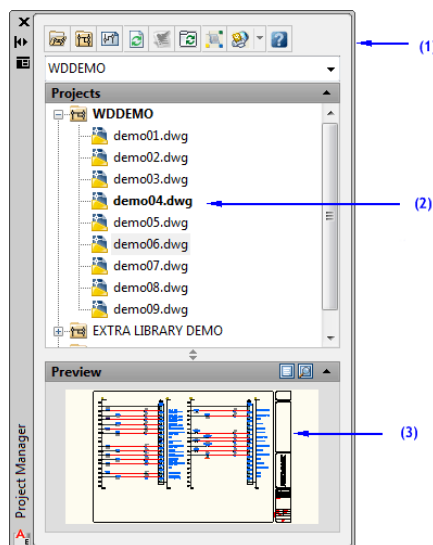


Project Manager Display Configuration

All AutoCAD Electrical Users


If you have AutoCAD Electrical 2013 installed, please ensure that you install service pack 1 as drawings are not visible in the Project Manager drawing preview (3) when drawings are saved in the 2013 format otherwise.

The Project Manager is split into three primary parts as detailed below. In this month's Tips and Tricks we are going to cover the *Project Drawing List* and the *Project / Drawing Detail*




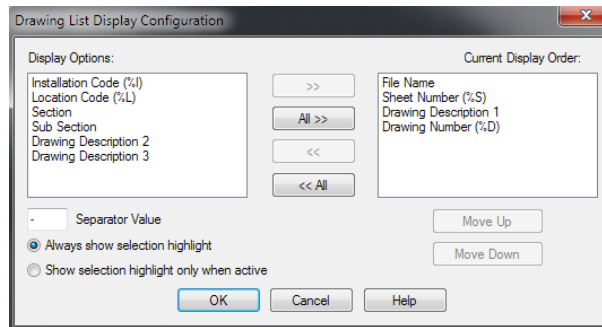
1. Project Manager Utilities
2. Project Drawing List
3. Project / Drawing Detail


Project Drawing List (2) can be altered by selecting the command

 *Drawing List Display Configuration* available from the *Project Manager Utilities* (1)

As an example of this you may wish to change the information to include the Sheet Number, Description and Drawing Number.

By highlighting the relevant option from the left of the dialogue you can select  to include the field in the Current Display / Order



Select  to save any changes

This configuration is unique to the users profile and therefore has to be repeated on the required number of PC's / installations

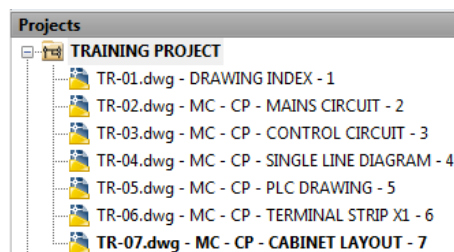
The Project Drawing List (2) will now show the detail defined in the *Current Display / Order*

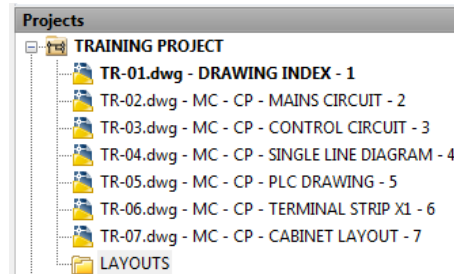
Basically the user is able to create their own folder structure and have different folders for different document types as an example.

In the following example, you may want to group all of the layout and terminal drawings in their own folder.

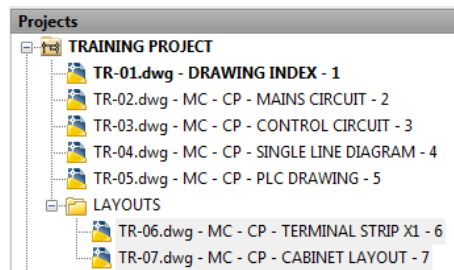


Right click over the Project and select Add Subfolder

Rename the subfolder to your required folder name e.g. LAYOUTS





Using *Ctrl* and *Shift*, highlight the drawings you wish to drag into the Subfolder



The creation of subfolders do not create a Windows sub-directory and it is purely a way of organising and visualising your drawings

Project / Drawing Detail (3) there are two options:

-  **Details** This shows basic information about the drawings, description and location
-  **Preview** This shows a preview of the drawing. N.B. It is recommended to save on Zoom Extents
